Activity Descriptions

Oak Hill School (90 minute session)

Built in 1886 to serve the Knob Creek Community, Oak Hill School welcomed 1st - 8th grade students until it was closed in the 1950s. In the 1990s, the school was relocated to Jonesborough to save it from demolition. The building was restored to its 1892 appearance, and today students can participate in the Oak Hill School Heritage Education Program. Reading, writing, arithmetic, history, geography – even the Pledge of Allegiance – are all as they were prior to the turn of the last century. Our curriculum is based on the detailed 1892-93 diary of a Washington County School Superintendent. Multi-age groups receive a very authentic one room school experience.



Main Street Town Tours (60 minute tour)

A costumed guide will lead students down Main Street Jonesborough and talk about the town's history, the buildings, and the people who made their lives in Tennessee's Oldest Town. Guides will share several, historical pictures of the town to help bring the past to life.



Chester Inn State Historic Site and Museum

Students will have the opportunity to participate in history hunts and tour period, restored rooms from 10:30pm – 6:00pm in the oldest commercial building in town. The Main Street Town Tour leaves from the Chester Inn.

Old Jonesborough Cemetery Tours (60 minute tour)

At the top of East Main Street sits the “public burying ground.” The Old Jonesborough Cemetery contains Rocky Hill and College Hill Cemeteries. The guide will lead groups through the cemetery and talk about 1800s burial customs, as well as the lives of the people buried there.



Chucky Depot Railroad Museum Activities (60 minutes)

The Chucky Depot Railroad Museum opened last October in Jonesborough. This 1906 Depot was relocated from Chuckey, TN, and restored to its early 1900s appearance. Activities inside the Depot will focus on the history of the railroad, what it could bring you, and different forms of railroad communication. After you finish your homeschool day activities, the museum will be open from 1:00pm – 5:00pm, so you can tour the exhibits on your own pace.



Hands-On with Artifacts in the Jonesborough/Washington County History Museum (60 Minutes)

Museums are made up of artifacts, but curators don't always know what those artifacts were originally used for. Students will put their history detective skills to the test with some strange artifacts from the collections of the Jonesborough/Washington County History Museum.

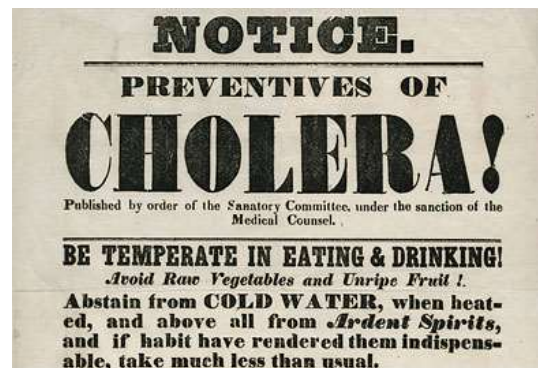
Archeology Activity (60 Minutes)

What is it like to be an archeologist? How do you interpret the pieces and fragments you find in the ground? Students will have an opportunity to work with two archeologists on a mock dig site.



Primary Source Activity: Cholera Epidemic of 1873 (60 Minutes)

In 1873, cholera swept through Jonesborough, TN. Using newspaper accounts and other primary sources, students will investigate that time in Jonesborough and discover who left, who stayed behind to help, and who perished from the disease.



Primary Source Activity: Finding Rhea Wells (60 Minutes)

Rhea Wells, native of Jonesborough, was an author and illustrator of children's books. He was also a very private person; even his family never knew he had once been married. What work did Wells do? What legacy has he left for the town of Jonesborough? How can information about Wells be found? What records are helpful? Come follow the path through Wells' life and work, his art, and his writing. Help to decipher a poem he wrote. Experiment with either his artistic or writing style.

Listen to Stories with a Storyteller (60 Minutes)

Jonesborough is known as the Storytelling Capital of the World. Hear stories from a professional storyteller and member of the Jonesborough Storyteller's Guild. Mother Goose might even make an appearance
