Activity Descriptions

Oak Hill School (90 minute session)

Built in 1886 to serve the Knob Creek Community, Oak Hill School welcomed 1st - 8th grade students until it was closed in the 1950s. In the 1990s, the school was relocated to Jonesborough to save it from demolition. The building was restored to its 1892 appearance, and today students can participate in the Oak Hill School Heritage Education Program. Reading, writing, arithmetic, history, geography – even the Pledge of Allegiance – are all as they were prior to the turn of the last century. Our curriculum is based on the detailed 1892-93 diary of a Washington County School Superintendent. Multi-age groups receive a very authentic one room school experience.



Main Street Town Tours (60 minute tour)

A costumed guide will lead students down Main Street Jonesborough and talk about the town's history, the buildings, and the people who made their lives in Tennessee's Oldest Town. Guides will share several, historical pictures of the town to help bring the past to life.



Chester Inn State Historic Site and Museum (open from 11:00am – 4:00pm)

Students will have the opportunity to participate in history hunts and tour period, restored rooms from 11:00am – 4:00pm in the oldest commercial building in town. The Main Street Town Tour leaves from the Chester Inn.

Old Jonesborough Cemetery Tour (60 minute tour)

At the top of East Main Street sits the “public burying ground.” The Old Jonesborough Cemetery contains Rocky Hill and College Hill Cemeteries. The guide will lead groups through the cemetery and talk about 1800s burial customs, as well as the lives of the people buried there.



Chuckey Depot Railroad Museum Activities (30-60 minute activities)

This 1906 Depot was relocated from Chuckey, TN, and restored to its early 1900s appearance. Activities inside the Depot will focus on the history of the railroad, what it meant to the region, different forms of railroad communication, and more!

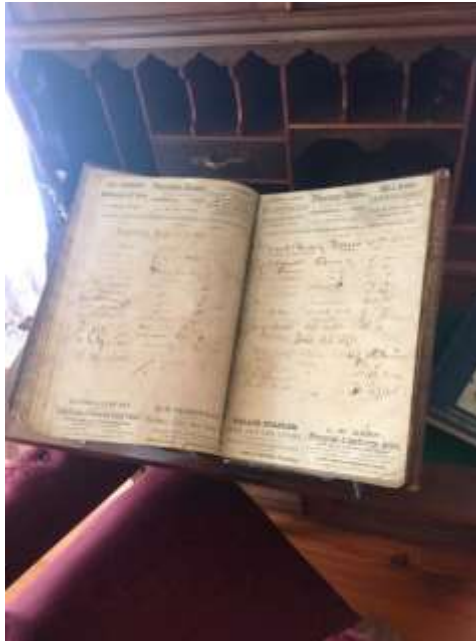


Hands-On with Artifacts in the Jonesborough/Washington County History Museum (30-60 Minute activities)

Museums are made up of artifacts, but curators don't always know what those artifacts were originally used for. Students will put their history detective skills to the test with some strange artifacts from the collections of the Jonesborough/Washington County History Museum.

Primary Source Activity: First Hand Accounts of Jonesborough (60 Minutes)

This activity is designed to get students introduced to the practice of examining primary sources. Students will learn information about the Chester Inn, its guests, and the town of Jonesborough through primary source work. By the end of this activity students will be able to:



- Identify types of primary sources
- Pick out specific information from a primary source
- Analyze potential issues with using primary sources
- Use critical thinking to place primary sources in a broader historical context.

Listen to Stories with a Storyteller (60 Minutes)

Jonesborough is known as the Storytelling Capital of the World. Hear stories with Judy “Butterfly” Farlow, a professional storyteller and member of the Jonesborough Storyteller’s Guild.
